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#### In an Emergency

An emergency is when any of the following happen:

- The reliever inhaler doesn't help
- Symptoms of cough, wheeze, breathlessness or tight chest get worse.
- The child is too breathless or exhausted to speak or is unusually quiet.
- The child's lips are blue

#### School's ActionPlan

Continue to give the child 1 puff of reliever inhaler (blue) every minute for 4 minutes. (4 puffs) After 5 - 10 minutes, the child should feel better & be able to return to normal activities.

If the reliever inhaler has no effect after 5-10 minutes, call 999 for an ambulance. Continue to give the reliever inhaler 1 puff every minute until the ambulance arrives. Inform the child's parents.

# School Asthma Health Plan - Part 2 Use of School Emergency Salbutamol (Blue) inhaler

From 1st October 2014, the Human Medicines Regulations 2014 will allow schools to keep a "Salbutamol" inhaler for use in emergencies. This will be used for any pupil with asthma or who has been prescribed an inhaler as a reliever medication. This can only be used if the pupil's prescribed inhaler is not available.

As your child is on our Asthma Register, we ask that you also give your permission for the Emergency inhaler to be administered should the occasion arise.

In the event of my child displaying symptoms of Asthma and if their inhaler is not available or unusable, I consent for my child to receive the school "Salbutamol" Emergency inhaler.
